## Great Things Are Happening.... Class of 2019



- 100% Graduation rate 131/131
- 98% matriculate to higher education
- 96% acceptance rate to 4yr college
  - 68% attending 4yr college/university
  - 30% attending community college
- 49% are first generation college-bound students
- 88% of eligible juniors and seniors participated in Concurrent College Enrollment Programs

93% of the students in the Class of 2019 are state identified as College and Career Ready for college admission


#### • IPOLY PTSA

#### **Campus Safety**

- CPP Police are **first responders** for all emergency situations

### **Graduation Requirements**



- Student must complete a minimum of 240 credits
   the UC a-g course requirements to earn an IPoly diploma.
- This includes 210 credits of required core courses and a minimum of 30 credits in additional courses. **Required Academic Content:** 
  - English/Language Arts- 40 credits
  - Mathematics-40 credits
  - Science 40 credits
  - Social Science\*-40 credits
  - Foreign Language-20 credits
  - Physical Education-20 credits
  - Visual and Performing Arts-10 credits
  - Additional Required Courses- 30 credits
  - 100 Community Service/Service Learning Hours
- Completion of each semester grade project (60% or greater)

\*9<sup>th</sup> grade SS may be waived for transfer students

#### Curriculum



"Learning while producing" is the International Polytechnic approach to education. IPoly's college preparatory program is project-based: students work in interdisciplinary, collaborative groups to apply learning to real-world situations. Each project is constructed to:







#### Concurrent College Enrollment

- Three Programs (Eligible juniors and seniors)
  - CalPoly Pomona: Young Scholars 3.0 GPA
    - (FA 2018 = 51, SP 2019 = 50)
  - Mt Sac Dual Enrollment: On campus
    - (FA 2018 = 120, SP 2019 = 119)
  - Special Admit Program: Courses on Community College Campuses
    - (FA 2018 = 19 students, SP 2019 15)

Units are transferable to other colleges and universities and classes are approved by IPOLY before enrollment


During the 2018-2019 school year, 88% of juniors and seniors took a concurrent college course



#### **Attendance & Procedures**



- Parent will notify attendance office when student is absent (send note upon student return or call)
- Indicate reason for absence
- See Handbook for excused absence policy
- Tardy students must check into the main office when tardy
- Excessive tardiness will be addressed by administration
- Parents will be notified via voice message of daily tardy or absence
- AERIES Parent Portal provides access to attendance and grades
- Drop OFF: Follow all traffic laws in parking lot
