11th Grade English Course Description Mrs. Edwards

COURSE OF STUDY:

In this class we will make connections between history and literature, develop our writing, research, reading and speaking skills, and strengthen our vocabulary. We will read a variety of texts and will complete writing tasks designed to expand your knowledge about themes related to your yearlong study of changes in society.

READING:

1st semester:

Sir Gawain and the Green Knight

Canterbury Tales (Prologue + 2 Tales)

2nd semester:

Macbeth

Candide

Fahrenheit 451*

WRITING WORKSHOP:

Throughout this course, students will need to build upon their knowledge of narrative, informational and persuasive writing styles and learn to incorporate clearly defined thesis statements, smooth transition sentences, and various organizational strategies into their writing. Students will adhere to a regimented, long-term schedule that requires them to upload pieces to turnitin.com and assess peer work.

HARKNESS:

As per Wikipedia: "The Harkness table refers to a style of teaching wherein students sit at a large, ovular table with their teachers. It encourages classes to be held in a discursive manner... [T]he method's name comes from the oil magnate and philanthropist Edward Harkness, a graduate of St. Paul's School (Concord, NH) who presented the school with a monetary gift in 1930. He described its use as follows: What I have in mind is [a classroom] where [students] could sit around a table with a teacher who would talk with them and instruct them by a sort of tutorial or conference method, where [each student] would feel encouraged to speak up. This would be a real revolution in methods."

Harkness is student-run, with very little teacher input given. Everything will be fair game – assigned readings, SSR readings, blog assignments – and students will be assessed on the amount and quality of their participation. Be prepared for class each day because you never know if it'll be a Harkness day.

1) Be respectful.

Take personal responsibility for your learning: set goals, evaluate progress towards those goals, adhere to high standards and revise your performance when needed. You can also take responsibility for your learning by asking questions when something is unclear, participating in classroom discussions and asking for extra help if you need it. Take ownership of your classroom. This is your space and your area to learn; help keep it clean and organized. This is your education – get everything you can out of it!

HOMEWORK AND ASSIGNMENT POLICIES:

- * All assignments, unless otherwise specified, must be word processed using 10-12 point, Times New Roman font, 1.5 or double spaced.
 - * Copying, cheating, or plagiarizing are grounds for failing the assignment.
- * In order to receive full credit on all assignments, students must turn in their work on the designated due date. The 11th grade team does not accept any late work.
- * Make-up work for daily class/homework is allowed for excused absences and must be turned in on the next class meeting after the student's return.
- * Long-term assignments must be turned in on the day they are due regardless of excused absence or an automatic NC will be given.
- * Revisions for any work (project components, formal essays, etc.) will be allowed only for work that has received a CR or lower.

You must submit all assignments on time to be eligible for full credit.
